

General Information about the Lorma Medical Center Medical Rotation/Observership Program:

Information and eligibility criteria for the Lorma Medical Center Medical Rotation/Observership Program are subject to change.

Rotations are two to four weeks long and are available to fulltime students in any year and in good academic standing who are enrolled in approved medical schools.

Applications for the Lorma Medical Center Medical Rotation/Observership Program should be submitted at least one month prior to the start of training. Submit all applications to:

International students participating in the Lorma Medical Center Medical Rotation/Observership Program may request a *Tourist Visa* (if stay is more than 21 days).

Visiting students are responsible for their own room and board. It is strongly recommended that students make housing arrangements prior to arriving in the area.

Medical students are required to attend an Interview and Orientation at the start of their medical rotation or see the Assistant Medical Director for Staff Development & Training.

Upon successful completion of the program, the Assistant Medical Director for Staff Development & Training, Dr. Raymond L. Espinosa, will provide a certification letter signed the Medical Director, the Assistant Medical Director for Staff Development & Training, and Assistant Medical Director for Medical Specialists Relations, with the Lorma Medical Center seal, confirming that the student had duties and responsibilities at various departments of the hospital.

The following documents are required:

1. Completed application form (Download [Online Application Form](#))
2. Official copy of the student's transcript of records
3. Recommendation letter from the dean or assistant dean of the College of Medicine of the university
4. Proof of *personal medical insurance coverage*
Proof of coverage must be in English and must extend during the student's entire stay in the Philippines
